HOUSE OF MOTHER'S AGENDA

It's a question on Sri Aurobindo's Aphorisms.

51 - "When I hear of a righteous wrath, I wonder at man's capacity for self-deception."

Wonderful!

There was a question: "Our self-deception is always 'in good faith'; we always act for the good of others or in the interest of humanity - and to serve you, that goes without saying! How exactly do we deceive ourselves, and how can we truly know?"

It's terribly true.

Just yesterday, even before I read this (I didn't read it), I had a long vision on the subject, that's the surprising thing! But on such a different plane...

Yes, when we regard the higher part of our mind as the judge of our action, that's how we can deceive ourselves "in good faith." In other words, the mind is incapable of seeing the truth and it judges according to its own limited capacity - not only limited but unconscious of the truth; so then, as far as it's concerned, the mind is "in good faith," it does the best it can. It's like that.

Naturally, those who are fully conscious of their psychic cannot possibly deceive themselves, because if they refer their problem to the psychic, they can find the divine answer there. But even for those who are in contact with their psychic, the answer doesn't have the same character as the mental answer, which is precise, categorical, absolute, and imposes itself - the psychic answer is more a TENDENCY than an assertion. It's something that can still have different interpretations in the mind.

Which brings me back to my experience of yesterday. After looking at the problem, I reached the conclusion that it's impossible to reproach a human being who does the best he can according to his consciousness, because how can he go beyond his own consciousness?... That's precisely the error most people make: they judge someone else according to their own consciousness, but the other person doesn't have their consciousness! Therefore they can't judge (I am only talking about people of goodwill, of course). To the vision of a more complete or higher consciousness, someone else is in error, but to the person himself, he's doing as best as he can what he thinks he has to do. Which amounts to saying that it's absolutely impossible to blame someone who acts sincerely according to his own limited consciousness. And in fact, seen from that standpoint, everyone has a limited consciousness, except THE Consciousness. It's only THE Consciousness that isn't limited. But all manifestations are necessarily limited, unless they emerge from themselves and unite with the supreme Consciousness - then... In what conditions can that happen? It's the problem of identification with the Supreme, which is the Supreme One - One that is all. *(silence)*

There is a whole side of human thought which has held the conception that identification with the supreme Consciousness could only come through the abolition of the individual creation, but in fact Sri Aurobindo said it was possible WITHOUT doing away with the creation. They hold the conception that the creation must be done away with because they don't take the creation beyond the human creation - it's impossible for man, but possible for the supramental being. And that will be the essential difference of the supramental being: being able, without losing a limited form, to unite his consciousness with the supreme Consciousness. But it's impossible for man. That I know.

As I said, you have it [*union with the supreme Consciousness*], but as soon as you want to express it, it's finished, it becomes again... (*gesture as if shut up in a box*). That means the substance we are built with isn't sufficiently purified, illumined, transformed (anything, any word) to express the supreme Consciousness without distorting it.

(silence, Mother enters an experience)

It's a certain opacity of Matter, of the substance, which prevents it from being able to manifest the Consciousness... and that same opacity (I don't know what to call it), that opacity is what gives Matter the sense of existing. It's part of the experience of these last few days. For... I don't know, for weeks I lived in a sort of fluidity - a transparent fluidity - and as that transparent fluidity is replaced by this something I now call "opacity," a sort of concretization of the body's existence comes back.

You understand, the psychic being's direct contact with the bodily substance, without intermediary, gives the sensation... (is it "sensation"? I don't know; it's neither sensation nor perception), it's a sort of "felt vision" - and that vision is very precise, very precise - of the value of the vibrations in comparison with a higher vibration which is (this is as much as I can say) more directly expressive of the supreme Vibration.

It's difficult to express, but the body is now living an experience it had never had, like going from an imprecision to a precision, from a sort of fluidity to... it's not something concrete, but from something fluid - fluid and imprecise - to something precise. Any event (any small event that happens to the body) is an occasion for a new perception. Previously, everything was fluid and imprecise; now it's beginning to grow more precise - more precise, more accurate. But it loses a little of its fluidity. It's very hard to express. I had never thought about it. Strangely, it's not deliberate, I've just now had the experience. So it's not very clear yet. In reality, the mind provides a precision which is lacking when it's not there. Its role in the creation has been, as a matter of fact, to make things precise, to explain them, and at the same time to limit them.

Funds and Assets Management Committee (FAMC)

June 2015 Report

Regular members: Anandi (Auroville Board of Services), Chali (Sri Aurobindo International Institute of Educational Research), David (Forest group), Jeff (Farm group), Mandakini (Working Committee), temporarily out of station (TOS), Matriprasada (Auroville Council), Michael (Auroville Unity Fund) TOS, Rathinam (Budget Coordination Committee), Sauro (L'avenir d'Auroville), Sonja (Housing Service) TOS, Ulli (Auroville Board of Commerce), and Mr. Srinivasmurthy (Finance & Administrative Officer, Auroville Foundation; currently Secretary-in-Charge).

Temporary membership: Yuval (Housing Board) is attending in place of Sonja through end-July, and Angela (Working Committee) is attending in place of Mandakini beginning-June to beginning-July.

TRUST & UNIT TOPICS

The Auroville Board of Commerce (ABC) recommended, and FAMC approved, the appointment of one additional executive, Slava, to Mitra Auroville. The current executives are: Arjun, Ulli, and Michael Bonke.

ABC recommended, and the FAMC approved, the unit "Gecko!" executive changes as follows: the addition of V. Panneerselvam and the resignation of Dotty. The current executive is Stephan H.

ABC recommends, and the FAMC approved, the unit, HERS, be registered under Kattida Kalai Trust, and an additional executive be appointed: M. Palani. The current executives are S. Vinod, and Gillian.

The Auroville Board of Services (ABS) endorsed, and the FAMC approved, Center Guest House executive changes as follows: the resignations of Tineke, Janet, and E. Saravanan, and the appointments of Cristina B., and Dodo.

Previously the FAMC had agreed, under certain conditions, to establish the Auromode Apartments as a guest house directly under the Auromode Trust. As the situation on the ground changed, and there were concerns expressed about a guest house not operating under the Guest House Trust, it was agreed to discuss the situation in more detail. After quite some deliberation it was finally agreed to leave Auromode Apartments under the Exploration (small guest house umbrella) for the time being. Towards the end of the fiscal year, for example January 2016, the FAMC will review the situation and see if it makes sense for a guest house unit to be created under Guest House Trust or Auromode Trust. *All concerned were informed.*

The ABS submitted to the FAMC the Non-Commercial Trust and unit version of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) (reference: ABC Commercial Trust and Unit MoU/used as the template). The Non-Commercial Trust and unit MoU was approved. [Note: ABC Commercial Trust and unit MoU was approved by the Governing Board in August 2014.]. *The ABS was notified accordingly.*

The ABC recommend to the FAMC to create a Hospitality Trust "that could serve as an umbrella for units offering lodging, food and in-house boutiques, a set-up that may not fit the present Guest Houses Trust." The FAMC decided to ask the ABC and ABS to collaborate on a detailed proposal, which can include 'pros and cons' of creating a Hospitality Trust, and look at tax implications, if any. *FAMC await their proposal.*

It was noted that the Auroville Board of Services (ABS) had not yet been formally constituted therefore the FAMC formally constituted the ABS, with effect from 1 April 2007.

In response to questions arising from the appointment of new executives to existing units, and the creation of new units with new executives, the FAMC formulated the following recommendations which were sent to the ABC, ABS, Guest Facilities Coordination Group, and Guest House Trust: a. The individual running the unit must be an Aurovilian, and residing in Auroville 9 out of 12 months; b. An executive needs to be competent to act. If an executive is receiving a maintenance or other material/financial support from the unit, s/he must be involved in the daily functioning of the unit, and; c. If a unit has 2 executives who are related it is recommended that the executives designate a "back-up" who will be responsible in case the 2 executives are unavailable or not able to execute their duties. The FAMC requested these points be taken into consideration when reviewing new unit applications and unit executive changes.

FINANCE TOPICS

The FAMC asked Mr. Srinivasmurthy if Auroville had to reapply under the Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA), as per a fairly recent notice. Mr. Srinivasmurthy confirmed that the Office of the Secretary, Auroville Foundation applied for renewal in April 2015.

LAND TOPICS

The Town Development Council (TDC) submitted a final draft of the greenbelt land allocation process for FAMC input. The paper was approved with the addition of text concerning activities that are neither farm or forest being directed to L'avenir d'Auroville/TDC, and a footnote that land allocation can be reviewed in case the land is not being utilized for the purpose for which it was allocated. The FAMC has the final authority of continuing stewardship, in collaboration with the relevant group (i.e. Farm, Forest, L'avenir). Once confirmed the change is agreeable to TDC/Green group, the FAMC will publish the process in the News & Notes and on the AuroNet. *The FAMC await a response from the TDC and the Green group.*

The Land Board (LB) requested about Rs. 8 lakhs (rupees eight lakhs) for an RCC cement slab wall at Bharathipuram. This was approved. *The LB was promptly notified.*

The TDC recommended giving stewardship of plot IR 407/2 (adjacent to Mahalakshmi Park) to Alain G. and Glenn who are joint stewards of Mahalakshmi Park. This was approved. *The TDC was notified.*

HOUSING TOPICS - *nothing new this month*

OTHER TOPICS

Hilde recommended moving the Health Fund under the Budget Coordination Committee (BCC)/City Services from the Health and Healing Trust. It was reported during an FAMC meeting that the BCC had already accepted this proposal. The FAMC gave its full support to this change. The BCC followed-up with Hilde via email, with a copy to the FAMC. [Note: the Health Fund is not a 'unit' under Health and Healing Trust. This arrangement has been an administrative convenience; the accounts have been managed under the Trust only. It is not necessary to obtain any further approvals for this move.]

The FAMC and Working Committee (WCom) met and discussed various topics such as the situation at Eco Service, Martuvam Healing Forest, as well as registering for an Auroville trademark under specific classes (with Vinodhini), the

Sustainable Livelihood Institute (SLI), Mohanam's cultural heritage project proposal, and commercial unit performance.

In response to a request by the TDC, the FAMC began a review of the formerly created Water Supervisory Board. It did not really flourish, so the FAMC have contacted individuals previously involved and asked for their reflections on what didn't work. Other Aurovilians working in the area of water are being asked to provide input as well. The aim is to create a Water Supervisory body with an oversight into all areas of water. The task of the Water Supervisory Board includes the appointment of Auroville Water Service executives and the TDC has requested the appointment of a third executive in addition to the existing ones. This action is on hold while the review is ongoing.

Following up from previous reports

In May the FAMC had some questions when it received the ABS endorsement of executive changes at Joy Guest House. In June all the questions were answered and thereafter the FAMC approved the changes which are the appointment of new executives: Giovanni, Stefania, and Sara; and the executive resignation of L'aura. Janet remains an executive.

In May it was reported that the FAMC had written to Martuvam Healing Forest (MHF) about moving forward. In June the FAMC received a response which didn't directly address the points of the FAMC. Presently the FAMC is making efforts towards the regularization of the situation of the unit and the assets, the unit executives and the accounts.

Last month the FAMC noted that it was reviewing housing subsidy. In light of the responses from the housing projects Kalpana and Sunship, the members decided to initiate a wider dialogue concerning pro bono housing allocation so as to be able to reach an understanding and agreement concerning general principles, eligibility criteria, and allocation/selection criteria and processes. It was decided to invite representatives from the Housing Service/Board, the Auroville Council, Youth Link, some members from the former ad-hoc committee who allocated Inspiration housing (11 apartments pro bono), as well as a couple of senior Aurovilians. *The subgroup is still being formed at the end of this reporting period.*

The FAMC continued to meet with the Sacred Groves project holders and in June reached an agreement with them about weekly monitoring and reporting, and how funds would be provided to finish the 3 prototype houses. *This is ongoing.*

In February it was reported the TDC informed the FAMC that Auroville Village Action Trust (AVAT) proposed a renewable land lease agreement with the Udhayam Women's Federation Trust. This month AVAT submitted the updated land lease agreement, which included all the points requested by the FAMC in February. The FAMC approved the updated land lease agreement. *AVAT and TDC were informed.*

Upon dissolution of the former Fund raising cell / Resource Mobilization Team, the WCom put at the disposal of the FAMC the remaining balance of funds raised. At present it is agreed that these funds will not be used for running costs or Aurovillian maintenance, with the exception of 2 months maintenance as a bridging fund for the Aurovillian who was working with, and supported by, the former team. To receive funds there should be a specific activity with a clearly stated objective. The FAMC have asked the Project Coordination Group (PCG) to make recommendations based on project proposals submitted to them. It has been suggested that a professional fund raiser be brought to Auroville to train Aurovilians about fund raising. In response to this suggestion the FAMC also asked the PCG to ascertain how many Aurovilians would be interested in such training. *FAMC await their reply.*

Auroville Council report May/June 2015

Dear friends,

Despite the summer, the Auroville Council has been relatively active, with some of our members being TOS.

We have been present in conversations - sharing - processes through our representatives in various working groups (Housing Board (Renuka), Security (Auroananda), FAMC (Matriprasad), BCC (Daniel) and regular joint meetings (Working Committee, Koodam).

We are also informed regularly by members of the Council who are also part of the Farm Group, Green Group, ABC support group etc., of the issues which concern our desk.

Currently, we are finalizing the **new Entry mandate & policy/guidelines** emphasizing the need, and encouraging the trend, of participation in our organization and decision-making processes.

For the **new Land Board mandate**, the subgroup is evaluating and incorporating the feedback received before re-publishing it for ratification.

An appeal process against the decision of working groups, currently undefined, remains a need we are faced with regularly; a process to define some parameters/ guideline for the same is being initiated presently, and is aimed to finished in the next 3 months.

Some updates:

NTDA:

The GM last week brought forth a better clarity on the current situation of the proposed NTDA. The RAS has set up a forum to receive feedback from all those present in the GM and will publish the meeting report soon.

New Entry Policy/ Guidelines:

The sub-group of the AVC has concluded its work on the Entry Policy. A larger meeting with Working Committee, more members of the Entry Service and 4 members of the Growth Action Group was held, in which the draft by the sub-group was shared and reflected upon. The feedback received in this meeting will be incorporated into the document before publishing for feedback from the larger community in the next few weeks. A GM is also planned to present the spirit of the new proposal.

Windarra conflict - implementing the arbiters' decision:

The Implementation Monitoring Group has invited representatives of the Farm Group to be part of it. Details at the ground reality level are currently being worked out.

Arya appeal process:

As per the Housing Policy in use, the Auroville Council is the body to deal with appeals against decisions of Housing Service. Upon Arya community's appeal against the decision of allotting an apartment in the community to Rajaram, the AV Council put together an appeal body consisting of Michael Z, Bunty and Guy.

They studied the issue in depth and concluded that the appeal in question was without merit.

The community has managed to reach an understanding regarding this situation following this process, helped by Anandi (PTDC) and Lakshmanan(Town Hall). Rajaram has been confirmed as the new steward of the apartment.

Resource Link:

A note explaining the Resource Link was published a few weeks ago in the News and Notes. Isha (Swayam) is currently preparing a questionnaire for "Resource Persons" from the community in collaboration with the Auroville Council.

Membership:

Davaselvam has resigned from the Council for reasons of too much workload. We thank him for his time with us and wish him all the best for his future projects.

The team will welcome Rita back only when she has demonstrated her goodwill to be part of the team by acknowledging her previous and present actions.

Next in our agenda:

- 1) FAMC: a subgroup is being formed to work on a new mandate.
- 2) Housing: within the next month we will be working on its mandate & policy and executives
- 3) The Contribution/ Maintenance policy to be reviewed in collaboration with BCC.
- 4) HRT mandate and membership to be reviewed in collaboration with the BCC
- 5) Green group mandate & guidelines to be published and posted for feedback
- 6) MM mandate and executives: process to start
- 7) Arbiters pool to be strengthened and enlarged in collaboration with Koodam
- 8) TDC functioning and mandate - to work in collaboration with the Working Committee
- 9) Security Policy and team renewal
- 10) Senior Care (stay, financial support etc.)
- 11) Unity Fund executives term of office

We intend to hold a General Meeting soon, in the coming weeks. We will keep you posted on the dates and venue.

Topics discussed:

Fertile - Building without valid permissions:

It came to the notice of the Forest Group that there are several buildings in Fertile which have come up during the

last years and where the agreed building application process has been ignored by the steward and the people building - some of them unknown to the majority of the Forest Group members and not Aurovilian.

The Group would like to hear from Johnny, the steward of Fertile, why this continues to happen and at the same time remind all members to follow the overall agreed process.

Adventure:

Members of Adventure Community and Kumar of Adventure Forest agreed in the meeting to harmoniously collaborate on defining the boundaries between the Forest part and the rest of the community. They will work together on physical boundaries and update the existing area maps so that this can be recorded with the Land Board.

Cristo reminds the group that the TDC is working on an overall development plan for the Greenbelt in which details of existing communities (overall area, types of development, existing infrastructure, community members ...) will be recorded.

Nilantangam:

Tom - who lives temporarily with his family in Nilantangam - approached the Group seeking advice on how best to deal with several areas in urgent need of fencing (at present there is still no central budget for further fencing released by the FAMC).

Cristo announced that the TDC is working on an overall strategy to make fencing more efficient. A relevant report is in progress and will soon be published by the TDC.

Meanwhile Tom will decide if it makes sense to use money generated by sales of wood and mangoes can be used for the most urgent fencing.

The next meeting will be on Friday, 7th August 2015, 15.00. The location has not yet been decided.

Security Advice

Dear friends,

This is to inform you that during the month of June, 2015, 1 theft (Samridhi). 3 attempt thefts (Nilathangam & Revelation), 1 fire incident (near Aryapai farm) and 1 accident (near Fertile) occurred in different areas of Auroville.

We request all Aurovilians/Newcomers/Guests to be more conscious of their valuable belongings and use additional locks for their vehicles and houses to lower the risk of thefts.

We recommend that women avoid travelling alone at night, and to store our security numbers in their phones to report any incidents as soon as possible.

Women of all ages and modest dress code have reported harassment, so be on your guard at all times. Be wary of three boys on a bike and do not stop for local men asking for directions. For post-incident support and counseling you may call the Women's help line (open in the morning) at 262-2425 or email AV health services: avhs@auroville.org.in.

For escort (for people with bikes/cycles only), call Ramesh.V at 9443090107 / 9443362691. Please note that the guards cannot leave their posts without prior permission from Security management.

To those who are leaving town: please inform your neighbours to keep watch over your houses/apartments. Kindly inform your watchman /gurkhas or house sitters to contact us immediately when there are any people / incidents to be reported.

We recommend all residents and guests to travel in and around Auroville:

- 1) With Xerox copies of your documents only. Leave the originals in your guest-house safe.

- 2) Not to carry large amounts of cash or valuables on your person unless absolutely necessary.
- 3) To secure/ tie up your bags properly or to keep bags on your person instead of in cycle baskets.



WOMEN SELF-DEFENCE COURSE BY GIACOMO COLOMBA

Venue: Joy Community Guesthouse Hall (Center Field)

Date/time: Tuesdays and Thursdays - 5.30 to 6.30 PM

Starting on Tuesday 21st of July

Giacomo has been practicing martial arts for the past 22 years and has been in Auroville since recently as a long-term volunteer of Joy Community. From 1997 to 2002 he has been focusing on Wing Tsun, which is a self-defense martial arts invented by a nun and traditionally transmitted to women only. Since 2005 he has been practicing grappling that is one of the most effective martial arts in real "street" situations, and Shou Dao that is very suitable to develop individual characteristics and to find the practitioner's own style without being restricted by orthodox decoded styles. Thanks to his long-term experience in all these techniques, Giacomo helps the practitioner to develop equilibrium, coordination, sensibility, fluidity, proprioception (perception of internal body parts), use of non-muscular energies, and awakening of spontaneous body "intelligence". The purpose of this 6-week course is to learn to act and react with "conscious" energy even before getting into physical contact with an internal feeling of secure action and

equanimity. As such, this is especially suitable and directed to women who want to be ready to respond to sudden aggressive approaches without needing much strength, constant training and body fitness.
